

RoHS Statement

RoHS (Restriction of Hazardous Substances) / EU Directive 2011/65/EU, The Restriction of the Use of Certain Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Equipment, was transposed into UK law on 2 January 2013. Directive 2015/863 known as RoHS 3 adds the four additional restricted substances (phthalates) listed below to the original list of six and came into force on 22 July 2019.

These Regulations implement the directive which bans anyone from placing on the EU market any new electrical and electronic equipment (EEE) in which any homogeneous material contains more than the tolerated maximum concentration values (MCVs) of the following substances: -

- Lead (Pb)
- Mercury (Hg)
- Hexavalent Chromium (Cr(VI))
- Cadmium (Cd)
- Polybrominated Biphenyls (PBB)
- Polybrominated Diphenyl Ether (PBDE)
- Bis(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP)
- Butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP)
- Dibutyl phthalate (DBP)
- Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP)

Based on ongoing communications with our suppliers and to the best of our current knowledge, the products supplied to you conform to the directive and do not contain more than the agreed levels, except for trace amounts from incidental environmental contamination.
